### **CAR CRUISING**

Car Cruising on the A421 along with the predicted weekly car meets that take place in the entrances to Eagle Farm South and Glebe Farm are something that the Parish Council and Thames Valley Police are keen to stop, for the safety of the car users during the time of these extremely dangerous race meetings. In order to support the eradication of those from outside the area, coming here and driving in such a dangerous and reckless way, please do continue to send in all evidence to the police and phone as soon as you begin to see them meeting up and cruising on our busy roads. In order to stop this from happening and prosecuting, the police need all of the evidence that they can get. Following a recent meeting with Matthew Barber (Thames Valley Police, Police & Crime Commissioner) we have been re-assured of the tactical and strategic efforts being made in order to eradicate this issue within the Parish.

#### **SPEEDING**

There have been reports of speeding in the residential areas across Wavendon and in order to support the Parish Councils desire to have a simple speed limit scheme in all housing areas as well as traffic calming measure, Milton Keynes Council Highways Department have asked us to gather a series of additional data via the Community Speed Watch Scheme. If you have an interest in reducing speeding in the residential areas of Wavendon and wish to volunteer and join the team, please contact the Parish Council directly for further details.

### **FLOODING ON THE REDWAYS**

Thank you to those who have previously reported the blocked draining systems by the underpass. MKCC came out, carried out the repairs and then subsequently the area because blocked again due to the poor weather at the time. After further investigation from one of the MKCC sub contractors, there is a physical blockage and it should have since been repaired now. Please do continue to report these incidents to MKCC via their "report it page" and take any images along with making a note of the exact location of where the blockage is at the time.

### LITTER

There have been concerns raised about the lack of rubbish bins and dog waste bins near to the new parks and pedestrian routes. Some have recently been installed, but as always please contact the Parish Council directly if you have any suggestions bins in Eagle or Glebe Farm.

### ALLOTMENTS

The Parish Council are working with the developers responsible for each of the allotment sites in Eagle and Glebe Farm so that they can be handed over in the best possible condition. If you are a resident in Eagle or Glebe Farm and have already shown an interest and are on the waiting list, The Parish Clerk will be in touch once each of the locations have been signed off.



### AMENITIES AND HEALTH SERVICES

Residents in the newer areas of Wavendon have reported concerns with the lack of local convenience stores, since moving to the area. Sainsbury's have signed a 10 year lease from completion, for the site

on Eagle Farm. There are ongoing discussions with L&Q for the development of four units in Glebe Farm which would serve as the local shops and services for the residents, which would be extremely beneficial for residents. With regards to access to health services, there have been issues and delays for adults and children trying to access NHS Dental and General Practice services in the area. There is a search function that can be used to locate your nearest GP Surgery (https://www.nhs.uk/service-search/find-a-gp) or Dental Surgery (https://www.nhs.uk/service-search/ find-a-dentist). But if you require further advice and guidance please do not hesitate to contact the Parish Council who will be able to signpost you to Doctor and Dental Surgery options in the local vicinity.

#### **COST OF LIVING CRISIS**

The cost of living crisis is both a national and local issue. Locally here in Wavendon, the food banks help to support families but there are often anonymous posts from people that need



financial help with food or hygiene products. Glebe Farm School with the support of the Parish Council and many other local and national organisations, facilitate warm space coffee mornings and foodbank sessions which can be accessed in the School's Community Hub building. If you are ever in need or emergency help or support please contact the Parish Council directly who will be able to provide support, advice and guidance in the first instance.

#### **HIGHWAYS ISSUES IN THE PARISH**



The Chairman of the Parish Council and the Parish Council meet bi-monthly with senior highways officers at MK City Council to raise and receive updates on numerous highways related issues across

the parish. Below is a brief synopsis on each issue but do feel free to contact the Parish if you feel you have a highways issues local to you in Wavendon parish that is not currently included Wavendon Contact: Parish Council Clerk clerk@wavendonparishcouncil.co.uk • **Speed Watch Scheme** – It was noted speed watch group has been establish for the Parish of Wavendon.

• Walton Road Traffic Scheme Refresh – Residents continue to ask when a review will be undertaken.

• Walton Road pavement repair – The Parish Clerk met with MKCC Highways on the 14 December 2022 in Wavendon and it was agreed that an assessment would be conducted. Waiting for confirmation that this work will be completed in 2023/2024?

• Walton Road double bend resurfacing - Clerk met with MKCC Highways on the 14 December 2022 in Wavendon and it was agreed that an assessment would be conducted. Waiting for confirmation that this work will be completed in 2023/2024? MKCC has repaired some pot holes.

• Cranfield Road / Lower End Road / Newport Road Speed Reduction. – we understand a scheme has been devised but we are awaiting details.

• Weight limit sign on Cranfield Road - Legally there should be a sign on either side of the road at this point. This is the junction along Cranfield Road with Crabtree Lane (to the left) and Crow Lane (on the right).

One was hit by an HGV and has never been replaced. Will new signage form part of the new scheme for Cranfield Road please and will the weight limit be announced at points well in advance of this location to avoid HGV's reaching the signage then reversing in the lane(s) to go back from the direction they have come, as happens quite frequently.

• **Cross End Closure Scheme** – The road will not now be closed as a through road. 1st phase has been completed and we are waiting for signs to be installed. Phase 2 – 'left in, left out' scheme will be carried out in the new budget year 2023/2024.

• Stockwell Lane 20mph traffic calming scheme. -Project should be completed in August 2023.

#### Elmswell Gate and The Groveway

Residents remain concerned regarding the road safety issues when turning out from the existing from the Towergate entrance.

• Burney Drive (Eagle's Rest / Glebe Farm – The Parish Council has already ensured that the road is a 30mph road with traffic calming features and a 20mph zone in the vicinity of the schools. There is a weight restriction on the road so any vehicles rat-running will be limited to a maximum of 7.5 tonnes. Concerns remain over rat running potential when the road fully opens in 2024.

• Kingston Roundabout Review – A Highways England issue that we continue to highlight.

### • Pedestrian crossing at St Marys School at Eagle Farm South.

Update provided by MKCC at the meeting held on the 14 December 2022 – Developer has provided a report stating that further pedestrian crossings are required. The report didn't specifically state that a light controlled 'zebra crossing' was needed, therefore MKCC has requested the Developer to consider a provision of a standard zebra crossing, which they have informally agreed to. MKCC are waiting for formal proposal to review.

Update provided by MKCC at the meeting held on the 8 March 2023 - Item still with developer BDW Trading Limited. The design, approval and construction of a crossing is a long process so will take some time, but MKCC will continue to chase BDW Trading Limited. Kingston Underpass Waterlogging.

• New footpath from Cross End (Newport Road junction) to the new Care Home at Woburn Sands Emporium. £50k 106 monies were agreed on the 27 April 2021 regarding planning application 20/02188/ OUT.

• **Signage confusion** - visitors are confusing the Stables Theatre with the new Community Hub.

• Road flooding at Cranfield Road (Lower End) opposite properties that open out directly on to the highway. The road at this point is maintained by Central Beds Council but repeated attempts to engage with that council have proven challenging.

• Newport Road – Road safety issues connected with access to and from properties on bend opposite the entrance to Wavendon Fields, campaign for a speed reduction to 30 MPH along whole route from station to Kingston roundabout and a light controlled pedestrian crossing close to the entrance to the Woburn Emporium.

I hope you have had a lovely summer. I am looking forward to returning to Parliament this month to continue working hard for the residents of Milton Keynes South.

It was brilliant to welcome the Prime Minister to the Milton Keynes University Hospital this month to showcase to him the plans for our new Women's and Children's Hospital and the plans for the future of the hospital estate. It was also announced that Milton Keynes University Hospital will be getting a brand new 22-bed ward this winter following the latest significant investment from the Conservative Government. This £3 million upgrade will mean patients can get seen faster whilst also freeing up hospital capacity. With better treatment, more capacity and faster treatments, it is only positive news for local NHS patients.

You may have seen the recent news that Bletchley Train Station has been included in the expansion of tap-in tap-out ticketing for rail passengers across the country. This means rail users will be able to use their phone or bank card to 'tap in' for journeys, rather than booking tickets in advance. I welcome this move, as I am sure many local residents will do too, because it will make rail journeys easier and more accessible for passengers. Hopefully, we will see other train stations in Milton Keynes join Bletchley in the near future.

More generally on ticket offices, I share the concerns that many residents have on the proposed closure of station ticket offices. While some changes are needed as fewer people buy their tickets over the counter, I am not satisfied that the current plans will meet the



needs of all passengers. As Chair of the Transport Select Committee in Parliament, I am scrutinising the proposals carefully.

Lastly, I am currently conducting an online survey to understand what local and national issues are important to you and your family. The feedback I receive from you will shape my priorities for the upcoming parliamentary term so I would encourage you to have your say. # St Marys Church & St. Marys School coffee mornings:

This has been a regular event that we have been attending, this is an excellent time for us to engage with residents, some have come from further afield than Danesborough parish itself. During our visits we have had the chance to offer advice whether it be crime prevention or how to improve people's own situations. We have had the chance to help safeguard people as well and make referrals for them to get more support. This attended when our shift pattern allows and there is always a welcome response.

# St Marys CofE School & Glebe Farm School engagement:

Over the academic year as a team there has been a great opportunity to engage with the schools in the local area including a visit to Bright Horizons day nursery. It is so important to have an impact at a young age to ensure that our young people don't fear the police, can ask questions and understand their rights that they have as an individual. We've been tackling subjects such as online safety, criminal responsibility, generic antisocial behaviour, and what the emergency services do and attend. With some visits around the police vehicles too. We would love to expand this also into youth groups as well, we already attend the Wavendon Gate Youth Café regularly. For the Glebe Farm secondary school there was a chance to have a careers day talk with question and answer session. They also recorded an interview for their own.

### Eagle Farm expansion:

With the ever increasing expansion of the parish this has seen us having to learn the geography of the area, an exciting time for myself as a PCSO getting an area that is expanding, getting to watch it grow. Also challenging in having to remember even more street names and getting the fun of going down alleys and cut through to discover where they come out! The ability to cut across from Brooklands when doing foot or cycle patrols is invaluable for ease of access.

### Ongoing Engagement:

We are regularly in attendance at the Walton Market just over in Walnut Tree, L&Q housing provider have a yearly community day, Broughton and West Ashland Fire stations open days have and are in the near future.

### Public Art — Funding for Arts Project(s) in Wavendon Parish

Culture was as important to our city's founders as the roads – it was an intrinsic part of the original city 'Masterplan' and was seen as a tool for community development, social cohesion, building aspiration and successful place-making.

People worked hand-in-hand with artists, creating artworks that would define the city's identity – including our most famous bovine ambassadors – the Concrete Cows, who now reside at MK Museum. Public art and creativity brought people together, encouraging participation and ownership of the city's public realm.

This tradition continues, Milton Keynes has an excellent reputation for commissioning public art and the city now boasts over 220 artworks within the public realm.

### What is public art?

In Milton Keynes we define public art very broadly, it could be creative signage, sculpture, bespoke outdoor furniture, landscape art, an artist in residence or one of many more creative outputs. Overall, we see public art as inviting the vision, creativity and skills of artists, to engage people with place, in a well-considered way.

### What does this mean?

Through working with artists, we seek to bring people together to consider place, how it is used, what it is like now and potentially how it can be improved or changed by creativity. Through this process we hope communities can share ideas and feel ownership of their area and the resulting artworks.

Milton Keynes City Council secures funding for public art through the planning process, this funding is ringfenced for projects in the area where development has taken place. This is where we need your help. ### Reaching New Footballing Heights in Wavendon

The start of any football season is always eagerly anticipated by everyone involved in the game. The start of the 2023/24 football season is even more exciting in Wavendon as new facilities begin to come online.

Hot on the heels of last season's opening of the new floodlit 3g surface at Glebe Farm School for Community Access comes one of the most significant and exciting new football facilities for local grassroots football. After a decade of planning, developing and finally constructing the playing surfaces, Wavendon Heights Playing Fields will eventually deliver one adult pitch, one 11v11 youth pitch, one 9v9 pitch and up to two 5v5 pitches . Delivered by Milton Keynes Council (working closely with Wavendon Parish Council) as part of the Strategic Land Allocation development at Glebe Farm, Eagle Farm and Church Farm developments, the grass pitches have been installed to the highest standards, incorporating the best practise in soil preparation, drainage and seeding. This will enable maximum participation with minimal postponements. Along with superb Sport England standard changing rooms and associated facilities at Wavendon Community Hub, it is hoped that the new facility will enable and encourage considerable community engagement and integration for all ages, abilities and backgrounds.



The pitches will be used by Woburn & Wavendon FC, who will also be responsible for the groundcare. The oldest and largest grassroots football club in the area, WWFC has been desperate for additional pitches for some years in order to cope with a massive growth in demand. Fuelled by increasing urbanisation as well as the growth in girls' football, Wavendon Heights will play a significant role in developing social cohesion and responsibility.



With the potential to also utilise new pitches at Glebe Farm School, Wavendon Heights will compliment facilities already in use at Wavendon Recreation Ground and St Mary's Primary School at Eagle Farm. It all makes for a very exciting time for community football in Wavendon.

If you'd like to get involved with your local grassroots football club, then there are opportunities for players of all ages and abilities. The Club is one of the largest and oldest in the area, with boys' teams, girls' teams and adult teams, as well as our award winning "GoalAbility" pan disability sessions every Sunday in Wavendon.

We're also keen to hear from volunteers for a host of roles including coaching, admin and groundcare.

### **Marston Vale Line News**

### Marston Vale Line Services

The three Class 150 (two carriage trains) which will serve the Marston Vale Line arrived at Bletchley Station from Newton Heath on 24th July. Each units has an accessible toilet and can accommodate wheelchairs, buggies and cycles.

Technician training has started. Driver training will commence once this has been completed. Unlike driving a car. train drivers require specific training for every different type of train, and also need to refresh their training for each line at regular intervals.

Train services are due to resume in the Autumn. Updates will be posted on the Marston Vale CRP website and social media platforms.

A full rail replacement bus service (all stations and limited stop) will continue to be provided in the meantime. All vehicles are accessible.

Andrew Mortlock, London Brick Archivist, will be bringing an extensive collection of archives, photographs and ephemera connected with the brickworks that used to dominate the landscape along the section of the Marston Vale Line between Bedford and Ridgmont and other areas of Bedfordshire. The Heritage Centre and Tea Room will be open as usual.


### What do you think?


