

The Local Resilience Forum (LRF) has established its command and control procedures to provide national updates, identify issues and to report back to government. The emergency planning unit is participating in these meetings.

A bit more on Foodbank Xtra

In partnership with Foodbank MK, MK Council is setting up a larger temporary storage and distribution centre at Saxon Court in Central Milton Keynes. The Council will be using the knowledge and expertise of Foodbank MK as it works to create an enhanced service, which will run to the end of June.

- There will be a new way for people wanting help to be assessed. This will be done
 on the telephone from one of the Council's Children's Centres (and not through
 agencies as is usual). Food parcels will be delivered to Children's Centres for
 collection. If a family in need is self-isolating the council will try to deliver to the
 home.
- Community Action: MK provides the strategic support and coordination of groups across Milton Keynes to enable them to provide safe and well organised support at neighbourhood level.

The decked parking solutions are incredibly expensive (ones we looked at for CMK were about £6M – it's ALMOST cheaper to buy a permanent MSCP) so I feel it is unlikely, with parking being free, that this would be a viable option. They would also still need planning permission as it would be significantly increasing the no of spaces which would be contrary to various sustainability policies, so I think PP would likely be refused. Also, the layout isn't ideal for these structures.

Project update from Highways England web site, 12 March 2020

The Oxford-Cambridge Arc is already home to some of the most productive towns and cities in the country. The Government's ambition is for further growth within the Arc that will help make it a world class economic hub, and delivering the right infrastructure is vital to support this.

The Government has investigated the potential for a new high-quality link road between the M1 and M40 which could support this growth and examined the costs and benefits of a range of options, taking account of the views of local authorities and residents in the Arc.

We are now pausing further development of the scheme while we undertake further work on other potential road projects that could support the Government's ambition for the Oxford-Cambridge Arc, and benefit people who live and work there, including exploring opportunities to alleviate congestion around the Arc's major economic centres such as Milton Keynes.

We will work with the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government and local partners on the proposed Spatial Framework to identify the role transport can play alongside the proposed economic and housing growth ambitions for the Oxford-Cambridge Arc.

Many local councils were planning to get involved in national events and celebrations such as Great British Spring Clean and **VE Day 75**, these have been postponed. The national commemorations to mark VE Day 75 on 8 May are being scaled back and the government is working on new plans to ensure the nation can still thank the Second World War generation on VE Day in May and provide the fitting tribute they deserve. Local councils are instead being encouraged to support local digital solutions for celebrations. Once this immediate crisis abates, communities may also be encouraged to turn their attention to planning for VJ day on 15 August. The Great British Spring Clean has also decided to postpone its annual event and relaunch later in the year, with the postponed campaign hoping to take place between 11 and 27 September 2020. CHANGES TO THE COUNCIL'S SENIOR MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE

Our current three directorate model plus small 'corporate core' was put in place four years ago. While this has helped teams share some closer practices and standards, we're yet to achieve our ambition for fully joined up thinking and working across the whole organisation. This can be frustrating for us, for councillors and for service users.

A new senior management structure is being developed that will help us operate more effectively as one council. The proposals are:

A new Deputy Chief Executive role will lead our critical support services, as well as a number of other business areas.

Instead of the current structure of three Corporate Directors and ten Service Directors, services will be led by nine Directors, who would all be regarded as 'chief officers' and full members of our Corporate Leadership Team (CLT). As you may be aware Duncan Sharkey has left the Council and we will not be replacing either his former role (Corporate Director – Place) or the role of Corporate Director – People.

The corporate core would be replaced with a new Chief Executive's Office, led by an Assistant Chief Executive (replacing the current role of Service Director – Policy, Insight and

Communications), whose focus will be on improving organisational effectiveness and performance. Public Health will move into the Chief Executive's Office.

Subject to political agreement, the new structure could be in place by early March. The CEO (Michael Bracey) will share full details then, including a detailed breakdown of who will be leading on specific areas.
