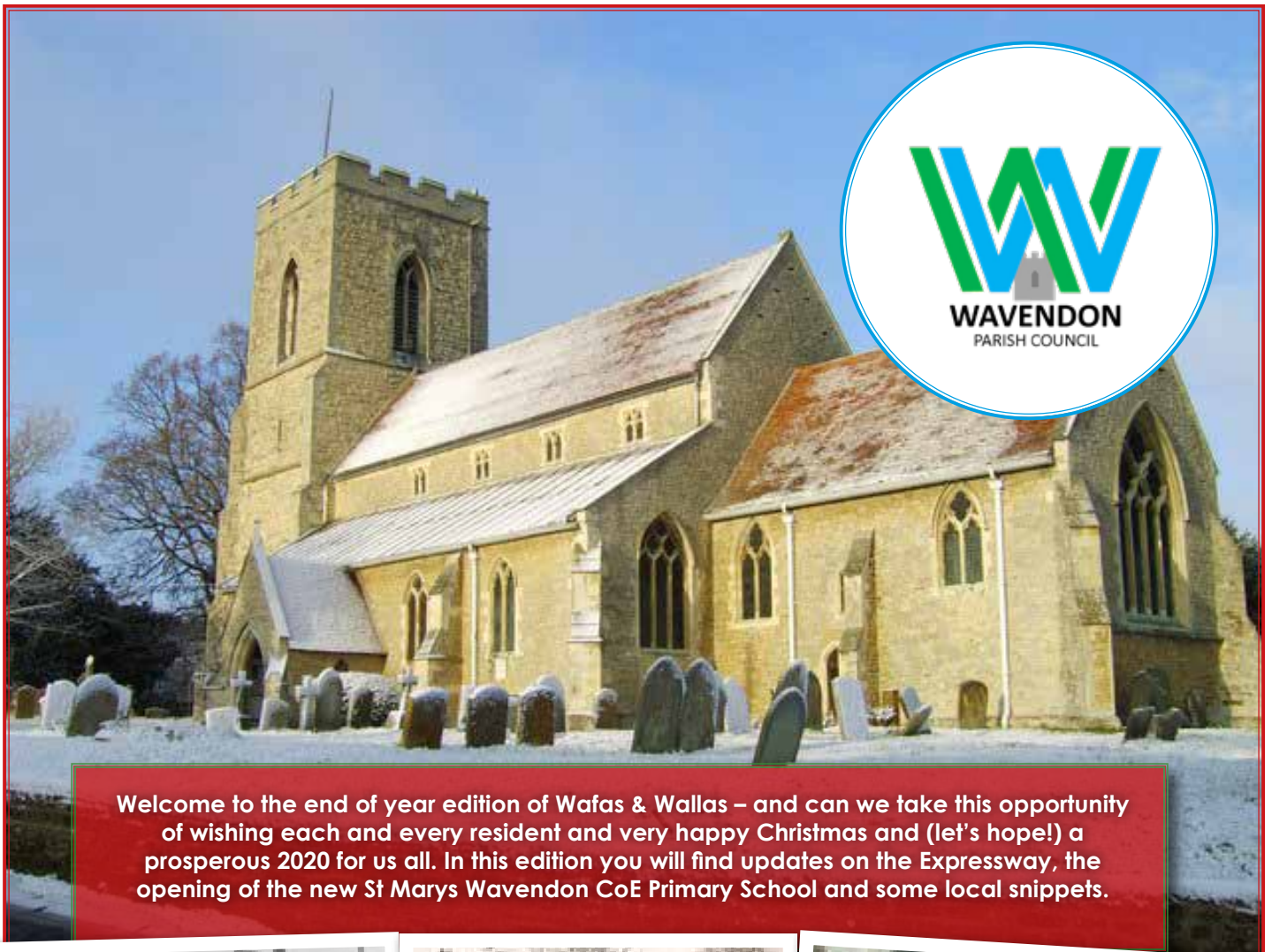

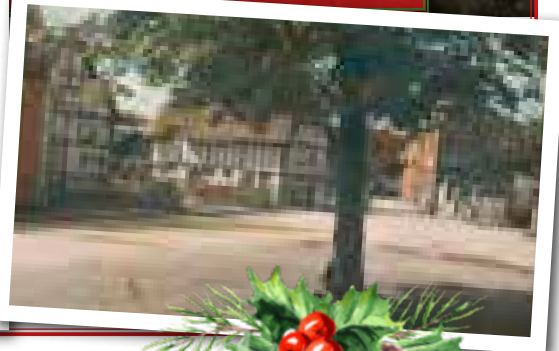

You will be involved in local decision making and strategic planning for the benefit of the people you serve. Seeing your community change for the better, as a result of decisions you have helped make, is something that can give you a sense of achievement and pride.

Eligibility for Parish Councillor (one of the following):

- (a)** is registered as a local government elector for the parish; or
- (b)** has during the whole of the preceding twelve months occupied as owner or tenant, any land or premises in the parish; or
- (c)** his/her principal or only place of work during the preceding twelve months has been in the parish; or
- (d)** had during the whole of the preceding twelve months resided in the parish or within 4.8 km thereof.

Station Travel Plans

As previously reported, MVCRP is working with London Northwestern Railway on three Station Travel Plans along the Marston Vale Line by local authority area.

The BBRUA Chairman and MVCRP Officer have been distributing "Access to Stations" surveys to passengers on peak services as one of the first steps. Please help us to inform improvements to, from, and at your local station by completing a survey. Copies will be available at the Christmas meeting or it can be completed online at <https://www.smartsurvey.co.uk/s/MarstonVale-LNR/>.

Alternatively, please contact the BBRUA and they will post one to you with a Freepost envelope.

We also need volunteers to audit the walking and cycling routes to and from each station, focusing on the first and last mile of a journey. **Can you help with this for your local station?** Training is provided and expenses reimbursed.

The Heritage Centre is open Tuesday – Saturday, 10:00 – 4:00 until 20th December.

The Tea Room is open daily all year round except Mondays 9:00 – 4:00. (closed 20th December – 4th January). Sundays open 11:00 – 3:00 - bookings only.

Marshall Aerospace possible move to Cranfield

- ▶ RAF and other overseas air forces Hercules Transport Planes serviced and maintained – if approved site would be in operation by 2028/2030
- ▶ Engine testing in enclosed hangers
- ▶ Hangers up to 40 metres tall
- ▶ 180 metre extension to runway
- ▶ 1500 staff would move from Cambridge site
- ▶ Considerable residential development anticipated in sites neighbouring the area of the proposed airport expansion in Cranfield
- ▶ The current CAA licence allows up to 1500 aircraft movements pa
- ▶ There is an existing planning consent for expansion of airport
- ▶ Local roads will be improved, especially access to A421 and into MK
- ▶ Support Expressway and links to Cambridge
- ▶ Marshall Aerospace are also considering RAF Duxford as an alternative site

At the end of the workshop, WSBC chair Dorothy Blackburn thanked Andrew and commented that it had been a brilliant day with lots of fun bridge! The event was held in aid of two local charities – the Bedford Hospice and Age UK Milton Keynes. More than 200 volunteers gathered at The Stables Theatre in Milton Keynes recently for the official presentation ceremony of the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service, the UK's top award for volunteering. The presentation was made by the Queen's representative, the Lord Lieutenant of Buckinghamshire, Sir Henry Aubrey-Fletcher, to Jim Rice, Chair of the Board of Trustees, and Helen Sturgess, one of the Stables volunteers chosen at random to collect the award on behalf of the whole group. The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service

aims to recognise outstanding work by volunteer groups to benefit their local communities. It was created in 2002 to celebrate the Queen's Golden Jubilee.

1. Each write to your MP and influential people in Milton Keynes Council. When a general election is announced email candidates and ask them whether they support/oppose the Expressway

2. Register as a group or individual stakeholder with Highways England.

3. Take part in Highways England consultation as soon as the 'route options' are announced

4. Work to cancel the Expressway before it is too late (promote East-West Rail as the alternative, preferably electrified). Start a 'Stop the Expressway' local group in your street.

5. Submit Environmental, Heritage, Wildlife and other information to Highways England (anyone can do this, not just registered Stakeholders)

6. When the time comes, register as Interested Parties for the Planning Inspectorate hearing – which could be the last opportunity to make your feelings known.

Historic England have informed the Parish Council that they have been considering adding the above site to the Register of Parks and Gardens of Special Historic Interest in England.

Historic England have taken into account all the representations made, and completed its assessment of the site. Historic England has decided to add Wavendon House landscape to the Register of Parks and Gardens of Special Historic Interest in England.

Please follow the link below to download a copy of the advice report, which gives the principal reasons for this decision, together with a map and a copy of the Register entry for this site.

From November 2019 this Register entry will also be available on the National Heritage List for England, which can be accessed through our website.

The Register in itself entails no additional statutory controls. The historic interest of a park or garden is, however, established as a material planning consideration, and the Register provides the key means by which sites of special historic interest are identified. It draws attention to the fact that the sites included should receive special consideration if changes or proposals for development are being contemplated.

Any queries about the registration of the site should be addressed to Historic England. If you have any enquires concerning planning related matters or would like advice on management issues, please contact the HE Regional Landscape Architect.

It is made clear in the Register that the parks and gardens listed are not open to the public unless



they are separately advertised.

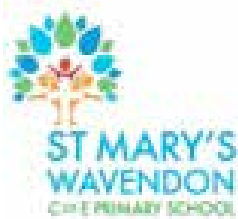

Snippets for December



Having spoken to MK Council Tree Officers, they confirm that the **TREE PRESERVATION ORDERS ON THE GOLF COURSE AND CRANFIELD ROAD ARE IMMINENT.**

- At the time of going to press, there do not appear to be any applications for the Cranfield Road/Lower End Road area that are likely to arrive in the near future. MK Council has had no more contact with the developers regarding the golf course – the Grade 2 Listed Garden designation may be the final nail in that particular coffin.
- A Senior Planning officer at the MK Council planning department has received a pre-application for 300-400 houses on land at the back of Deethe Farm and the Woburn Emporium. In any event that's not likely to come forward as an application in the near future –if at all.
- **THE LISTED GARDEN DESIGNATION AT WAVENDON HOUSE** is very strong – equivalent to a Listed Building. So not only does it protect the landscape covered by the designation, any proposed development on adjoining sites needs to be considered in terms of their effect on the setting of the listed landscape. It doesn't necessarily prevent development, but development does need to show that it doesn't negatively impact upon the designated landscape.
- The new mini **SID (SPEED INDICATOR DEVICE)** has been installed on Newport Road on a site just passed the 30mph coming into Woburn Sands. (a WSTC initiative). The solar panel has been installed on Hardwick Road outside Edgewick Field on the bend where the SID can be moved to after a month. The MK Council contractor (Ringway) has installed the third post in Cranfield Road just past the 30mph. In the next financial year budget has been given to installing the third solar panel and then this will be the third location.

MRS ROBINSON'S OUTING:

OLD SCHOOL CLOCK:

The clock was installed at Church End on the 6th October 1978 and it hadn't worked properly for over 10 years. The Parish council was successful in securing monies via the 106 tariff fund from Milton Keynes Council to have the clock restored by Smiths of Derby. There is still a requirement to have a battery back-up system installed to ensure that the clock records the correct time should there be an interruption to the electric supply.

Christmas and Winter Safety Advice



There's a lot to think about over Christmas and the winter months - but firefighters hope fire safety features prominently on your to-do list!

Decorations, cards, wrapping paper and Christmas trees can all act as extra fuel for a fire sparked by candles, overheated sockets, faulty fairy lights or cigarettes. The risks increase when you add cooking, drinking, parties, guests and extra heating into the mix.

Here's some seasonal advice from Buckinghamshire Fire & Rescue Service to help you celebrate in safety:

- Ensure you have a working smoke alarm installed on all levels of your home. Test your smoke alarms every month and never remove working batteries.
- Check on older relatives and neighbours this Christmas and offer to test their smoke alarms.
- Never leave cooking unattended. The majority of fires start in the kitchen, so this is a high-risk area. Avoid cooking while under the influence of alcohol, and always turn off kitchen appliances when you have finished cooking.
- Never leave candles unattended. Keep candles out of the reach of children, and away from decorations, cards, wrapping paper, fires, lights and heaters.
- If you smoke, make sure cigarettes are fully extinguished, and take extra care if you are tired or have had a drink.
- Don't block exits with Christmas trees and presents.
- Don't overload sockets. Always turn off plugs when they are not in use, except appliances that are designed to be left on, such as fridges and freezers.
- Switch off Christmas lights and unplug them before you go out or go to bed. Check your lights have the CE marking.
- Always use an RCD (residual current

device) on outdoor electrical equipment.

- Never use heaters to dry clothes. Heaters can start fires when things are placed too close to them. Keep them well away from curtains, clothing, furniture and decorations.
- In the event of a fire, get out, stay out and call 999. Make sure everyone staying with you over Christmas knows what to do in an emergency.

Girls' football is growing at a phenomenal rate, but nowhere more so than right here in Wavendon!

Woburn & Wavendon FC has one of the country's largest number of grassroots football teams. In fact the club has an all-girl team at every age group from under 8 through to adult women.

Long before the Lionesses of the England Womens' team were capturing the nation's attention, WWFC's Lionesses were thriving with a number of teams playing regular matches. Today the Club has eleven teams with five of the youngest groups playing in Wavendon. Wavendon Recreation Ground and the new St Marys C of E Primary School playing fields at Eagle Farm provide excellent venues for the girls to make the most of all the **FUN** and **FRIENDSHIP** football can provide.

Every year from March through to July the Club delivers the FA backed Wildcats Football centre, enabling local girls to sample all the excitement of organised football. Last year there were more than sixty participants – one of the largest attendances in England !

WWFC also holds one of the UK's largest girls' football tournaments in June, with nearly 150 teams attending over two days at Woburn.
